Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial results of **Parnax Lab Limited** ("the Company") for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2026, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these standalone financial results:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter and year ended March 31st, 2026.

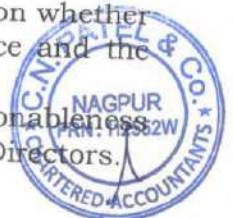

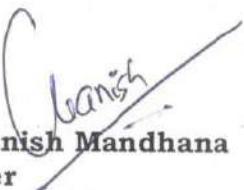

- The Financial results have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards ('Ind AS') prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with relevant rules thereunder and in terms of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended) and SEBI circular dated 5th July, 2016.
 - The above results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on May 28, 2026.
 - The Statutory Auditors have carried out a Limited Review of the above financial results of the Company for the quarter and Year ended March 31, 2026.
 - EPS for quarter ended is on non annualised basis.
 - The Company is dealing into one segment : Dealing in Pharmaceutical Formulations, hence Segment Reporting under AS17 is not applicable.
 - On November 21, 2025, the Government of India notified the four Labour Codes – the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – consolidating 29 existing labour laws. The Ministry of Labour & Employment published draft Central Rules and Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) to enable assessment of the financial impact due to changes in regulations.
The Company has assessed and disclosed the incremental impact of these changes on the basis of current remuneration structure. The current assessment is based on the best information available, consistent with the guidance provided by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Considering the materiality and regulatory-driven, non-recurring nature of this impact, the Company has presented such incremental impact under "Exceptional Items" in the standalone financial results.
The impact for the quarter ended 31 December 2025 consisting of gratuity and compensated absences of Rs. 2.16 lakhs was accounted in the standalone financial results primarily due to change in wage definition. Further, for the quarter ended 31 March 2026, additional impact of gratuity and compensated absences of Rs. 1.33 lakhs has been recognised. The impact for the year ended 31 March 2026 pertaining to gratuity and compensated absences is Rs. 3.49 lakhs. The Company continues to monitor the finalisation of Central / State Rules and clarifications from the Government on other aspects of the Labour Code and would accordingly take necessary steps for compliance thereof and also provide appropriate accounting effect on the basis of such developments, as needed.
 - Figures pertaining to previous period/year have been re-grouped, re-classified and restated wherever found necessary.
 - There are no proceeds of public issue, rights issue, preferential issue, qualified institutions placement, etc., therefore statement on the same is not forming part of this results.
 - There are no outstanding defaults on loans and debt securities, therefore statement on the same is not forming part of this results.
 - The disclosures of Related Party Transaction is applicable only for half yearly filings, therefore it is not forming part of this results.
 - The statement on impact of audit qualifications is applicable only for yearly filings, therefore it is not forming part of this results.

The respective Board of Directors of the entities included in the group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the consolidated financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

total revenues of Rs. 24,327.46 lakhs, total net profit after tax of Rs. 1,091.11 lakhs, total comprehensive income of Rs. 1,118.05 lakhs and net cash inflow (outflow) of Rs. (3.15) lakhs for the year ended 31st March 2026 as considered in the consolidated financial statement. These financial statements have been audited by the other auditor whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion and conclusion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiary, is based solely on the reports of the other auditors and the procedure performed by us as stated in Auditor's Responsibilities section above.

Our opinion on the Statement is not modified in respect of the above matter with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditors.

- The consolidated financial results include the results for the quarter ended 31st March, 2026 being the balancing figure between audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year which were subject to limited review by us.
